

Presentation of Action Plan

At the Affiliate (State) Competition, all teams will be required to create a presentation of the Action Plan written in Step 6 of the booklet and perform the skit before an audience. The presentations will be evaluated according to an official score sheet. The highest scoring teams will be recognized at the awards ceremony. Rules provided below may be altered within Districts, but rules will always be provided to teams prior to a competition. Districts may or may not require a Presentation of Action Plan for the Qualifying Problem.

Rules for Presentation of Action Plan

1. Presentations may have a minimum of three (3) and a maximum of seven (7) performing members.
2. Presentations must be at least two (2) minutes long, and last no longer than four (4) minutes.
3. A list of materials from which students may fashion props is provided below. No props may be prepared prior to the preparation time period at competition, and ***no additional props or materials may be used***. Four chairs will be provided (no table) and the team may choose to use them as desired.
4. A mystery item and mystery quote, revealed to teams after booklet work, **MUST** be included in the team's presentation.
5. Presentations are intended to be the work of the students. Monitors may provide constructive support while refraining from interfering with the creative process and making of props.
6. Teams will be assigned a presentation order and competition room.
7. One team member will read the team's Underlying Problem and a summary of the Action Plan to the judges/audience prior to the beginning of presentation time.
8. All teams are expected to remain as part of the audience until all teams in the room complete their presentations. Penalty points could be assessed for teams leaving early without permission.
9. Coaches, parents, and other members of the audience must refrain from providing assistance to the team in any form once a team begins the actual presentation. Penalty points may be assessed for outside interference.
10. Presentations must be appropriate for a school-sponsored event. Any offensive language or actions may lead to penalties or disqualification.

List of allowed supplies:

- 1 roll of tape
- Pen & pencil
- 1 box of aluminum foil
- 1 set of water-soluble colored markers
- 1 roll of paper towels
- 1 stapler and 1 box of staples*
- package of colored paper
- paper plates
- 1 magazine or newspaper

*Stapler, staples, and scissors may be used in construction
